Visionary Society Policies

- Clubs will receive banner patch awards reflecting their Visionary Society permember average level as well as public recognition in Lions' and campaign events and publications.
- Club recognition will be based upon the per-member average raised, not the total amount raised. In this way, Clubs of even the smallest size can achieve the highest levels of Club recognition.
- Per-member averages will be calculated twice a year during the campaign.
- Clubs can receive all five patches by achieving each level.


Current and Emerging Challenges

In today's world, 37 million people are blind and another 124 million suffer from low vision. A tragic figure - yet a smaller one than when SightFirst began its mission 15 years ago. Lions have changed the world, helping to reverse an anticipated trend toward increasing blindness.

Despite this success, many around the world still suffer needlessly from blindness and low vision - and the problem threatens to get worse.

The world's rapidly growing and aging population and new patterns of eye disease have given rise to new threats to sight. The sheer number of people older than 45 – 2 billion by 2020 - will make cataract blindness more menacing than ever. Glaucoma and diabetic eye disease claim the sight of many more than could have been predicted in 1990.

If no new action is taken, experts predict that these factors could cause the world's blind population to double to 74 million and those with low vision to double to nearly 250 million by 2020.



They hope – and need – Lions to live up to our commitment as Knights of the Blind. Lions can fulfill that commitment through Campaign SightFirst II. The power to make it happen is in your hands.





A Vision for All

Lions' determination to eliminate preventable and treatable blindness

remains steadfast. The crucial programs provided by SightFirst will control, and eliminate where possible, the major causes of preventable and curable blindness on a scale never matched, providing vision and hope to millions.

Our financial objectives are to:

Control and eliminate major causes of blindness -

- Develop comprehensive eye-care services
- Eliminate infectious eye diseases as a cause of blindness

Combat emerging threats to sight -

- Strengthen low-vision services
- Eliminate avoidable childhood blindness
- Develop sustainable approaches to refractive error in children
- Develop new capacities for controlling glaucoma and diabetic retinopathy

Total CSFII Minimum Goal: US\$150 million



- Expand and enhance Lions sight programs for high-risk population in developed countries



If we can exceed our minimum goal, additional funds will be used to:

Provide "Vision for All" -

- Fund rehabilitation efforts and education for the already blind
- Invest in research initiatives at Lions Eye **Research Institutes**
