4. No member shall receive more than one Key of the same type.

5. Charter, transfer and reinstated members cannot be used in applying for a Key.

Membership Development

A good membership development program contains the following basic elements:

- 1. Induction ceremonies should be meaningful and impressive
- 2. Orientation of new members should be implemented using the New Member Orientation Guide (LC-13).
- 3. Involvement of new and old members should be maintained at all times. An involved Lion is an active Lion!
- Meetings should be held in a convenient, desirable place determined by the members.
- Meals should be of good quality at a reasonable price.
- Programs should be interesting and appealing to the members.
- 7. Greeters should welcome visitors and members, especially the newer Lions.
- 8. Attendance can be improved by having Past Presidents call on non-attendees.
- 9. Ladies' Nights should be held periodically.
- Fellowship should be maintained by ensuring that members do not sit with the same group at every meeting.
- 11. Tailtwisting should maintain harmony, good fellowship and fun.
- 12. Inter-club visits should be an established Club program.
- 13. Club Bulletin should be interesting and issued regularly. 14. Public Relations helps club attain community support.
- 15. Annual Club dues should be set to enable the Club to meet its regular expenses and keep costs to members at a reasonable level.
