

IRVING L. CAMP, NOTED LION, CALLED BY DEATH

Irving L. Camp, past president of the Lions International, retired coal broker of Johnstown and well known in Altoona, died at the Parkham hospital at Henderson, N. C., late Tuesday night of a stroke and internal injuries suffered in an automobile accident Sunday while en route to St. Petersburg, Fla. Mrs. Camp was also injured but will recover.

Mr. Camp, who was aged 55, had been located at Johnstown for a number of years, being engaged in the coal business. Several years ago he was associated with a number of Altoona men in efforts to revive the coal industry in the central Pennsylvania field. He was prominent in activities of the Lions International. He organized the Johnstown club in 1922, became state president in 1923 and president of the Lions International in 1927. He is survived by his widow, one son, step-mother, a sister and two brothers. Interment will be made at his birthplace, Waterbury, Conn.
